NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

Prices Preliminary majority prices for whole birds are trending unchanged into the East and West, but unchanged to lower in the Midwest when compared to early week. Whole bird prices are steady to weak. Offerings are moderate to heavy with larger sizes in the longest balance. Demand into all channels is light to moderate at best entering the weekend. Floor stocks are moderate to closely balanced with purchasing limited to regular commitments. Market activity is slow to moderate. In the parts structure, demand is light to moderate. Prices are steady to firm for wings and tenders, cautiously steady for boneless skinless breasts, and steady for all other items. Supplies are light for wings and tenders, moderate to heavy for boneless skinless breasts, and sufficient for all other parts. Market activity for parts is light. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

SOUTHERN REGION Prices for whole broiler/fryers are trending steady to slightly lower. Offerings of all sizes are readily available for limited trade needs. Demand into all channels is moderate at best. Market activity is light to moderate. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate entering the weekend. Prices are trending steady to firm for wings and tenders, and steady for the remaining items. Offerings are light for wings and tenders, moderate to heavy for breast items, and moderate for dark meat cuts. Market activity for parts is light to moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed, but noted as mostly desirable.

NORTHEAST REGION Prices are trending steady for most sizes. Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers is light to moderate entering the weekend as hot and humid weather conditions hampers much of the area. Offerings of all sizes are at least sufficient for current needs. Market activity is slow to moderate. In the parts complex, supplies of tenders are in close balance and clearing satisfactorily; wings are light to moderate and dark meat cuts are generally sufficient for current needs.

WESTERN REGION The Los Angeles majority is 104, unchanged from last week. The market on whole birds is weak. Offers are moderate to heavy. Retail demand light to moderate. Foodservice demand moderate. Sizes mixed, mostly adequate for needs. Floor stocks generally moderate. Supplies of wings and tenders are light, bone-in breasts and dark meat items light to moderate, and boneless skinless breasts moderate to instances heavy. Prices trended steady to firm on wings and tenders, steady on bone-in breasts and dark meat items, and steady to weak on boneless skinless breasts. Market activity for parts is light.

MIDWEST REGION Preliminary majority prices for next week's delivery into Chicago are unchanged to lower from this past Monday's final majority. Whole bird prices are steady to weak. Offers are moderate to heavy with the larger sizes more available. Demand into retail and food service channels is light to moderate with best movement on eight piece cut-ups and rotisserie. Fast food is light to moderate. Buyers are keeping floor stocks closely balanced by purchasing hand to mouth. Sizes are desirable to heavy. Whole bird market activity is light. Supplies of wings and tenders are light, dark meat items and bone-in breasts light to moderate, and boneless skinless breasts generally moderate. Prices are steady to firm on wings and tenders; steady on dark meat items and bone-in breasts; and steady on boneless skinless breasts with a weak undertone. Market activity on parts is light.

DELMARVA Less-than-trucklot asking prices are unchanged at 83 to 91 cents with a steady to at least steady trending undertone. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds is light to moderate entering the weekend. Offerings of all sizes are readily available for current trade needs. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed, but reported as mostly desirable. Processing schedules are moderate. Market activity is slow to moderate. In the parts complex, wings and tenders ranged light to moderate and remained in the best position. Dark meat and breast items ranged moderate to at times heavy.

NORTHEAST BROILER PARTS Prices are trending firm to higher for tenders; firm for wings and steady for breast items and most dark meat cuts. Trucklot buying activity improved slightly entering the weekend but still noted as light to moderate overall. Offerings of tenders are light and clearing well; light to moderate for wings and sufficient for breast items and most dark meat cuts with leg cuts noted as slightly more available. Movement is slow to moderate.
