NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

Whole broiler/fryer prices are steady to weak in the Midwest, steady to instances firm in the West, and steady in the East. Preliminary majority prices are unchanged to lower in the Midwest, unchanged elsewhere when compared to early week prices. Offering are moderate to more available for current trade needs. Retail and food service demand is light to instances good entering the weekend. Floor stocks are mixed. Market activity is moderate. In the parts structure, movement is fair to moderate. Prices are trending steady to firm for wings and dark meat items, weak to lower for bone-in breast and steady for the balance. Offerings are light to moderate for wings and clearing well. Bone-in breast are available and slow to clear. Other items are sufficient for current needs. Market activity is slow to moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed at mostly desirable weights.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER The preliminary majority price for next week's delivery into the Chicago area unchanged to lower and in a larger range than Monday's final majority. Prices are trending steady to weak on whole birds. Offerings are moderate to more available. Retail and food service demand is light to instances good going into the first of the month. Best movement on featured items and into fast food channels. Floor stocks are mixed. Sizes are light to heavy. Whole bird market activity is moderate with buyers very cautious. Parts supplies are moderate to heavy on bone-in breasts and moderate on the remainder. Prices trended weak on bone-in breasts and steady on the balance of parts. Market activity on parts is slow to moderate.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Prices are trending steady for most sizes. Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers is light to moderate entering the weekend. Offerings of all sizes are sufficient for current needs. Market activity is moderate. In the parts complex, supplies of wings are light to moderate and clearing satisfactorily; bone-in breasts are available and slow to clear. Other items are light to moderate for current needs.

<u>SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER</u> Prices are trending steady for whole broiler/fryers. Offerings are mostly moderate for current trade needs. Demand into retail food service channels is mostly moderate entering the weekend. Market activity is moderate. In the parts structure, movement is moderate for late week trading. Part prices are steady for wings, weak to lower for bone-in breast, and steady for the balance of parts. Offerings are light to moderate for wings, moderate to heavy for breast items with bone-in breast slow to clear, and moderate for all remaining parts. Market activity for parts is slow to moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The Los Angeles preliminary majority is 106 cents, unchanged from last week. The market on whole broiler/fryers is generally steady. The WOG market is steady. However, the undertone on WOGs is mixed with buyers finding both lower and higher prices for next week's shipments. Offerings light to moderate, instances moderately heavy. Retail demand light to moderate, mostly light. Food service demand moderate to instances good for weekend. Bird weights generally desirable. Floor stocks light to mostly moderate. Whole fryer and WOG movement light to moderate. The market is on bone-in breasts with prices lower; wings, thigh meat and leg meat steady to firm with prices unchanged to higher, balance of parts and meat items steady for next week's shipments. Parts demand light to moderate. Offerings of bone-in breasts moderate to instances moderately heavy, balance light to moderate. Movement light to moderate.

<u>DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS</u> Less-than-trucklot asking prices remained unchanged at 100 to 108 with a steady trending undertone. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds is light to moderate entering the weekend. Offerings are sufficient for trade needs. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed, but noted as mostly desirable. Processing schedules are moderate. Market activity is moderate. In the parts complex, wings are light to moderate. Bone-in breasts are moderate to heavy and the balance of parts are moderate.

Offerings of wings are light to moderate and clearing well; bone-in breast are available and slow to clear. Other items are sufficient for current needs. Movement is slow to moderate.
