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

## Canada Publishes Special Agricultural Safeguard Price and Volume Triggers

The Government of Canada has given notice of the volume and price triggers that will be used to operationalize the World Trade Organization (WTO) Special Agricultural Safeguard (SSG) for Canada's supply-managed products. The Special Agricultural Safeguard is a provision that allows additional duties to be triggered automatically when import volumes rise above a certain level, or if prices fall below a certain level. The price trigger is an average reference price derived from average unit value of the imported product, or cost at the border of the importing country from years 1986-1988. These are historic prices and are therefore quite low and unlikely to be activated. Canada's volume trigger is based on 125% of the three-year average total imports. Canada has included supplementary imports in its calculations of the volume triggers. WTO rules require that any member taking action on the SSG notify the WTO Committee on Agriculture.

Canada's supply managed sector is protected by a tariff rate quota system that allows a fixed quantity (quota) of a product into Canada at a low tariff rate and, once that quota has been reached, subsequent imports of the product are subject to prohibitively high tariffs. However, Canada regularly issues supplementary import permits, such as when there are product shortages in the domestic market, and for the Import to Re-Export Program (IREP), where chicken processors can import chicken under a supplementary import license for use in processing provided they export the associated processed product. These supplementary imports are not subject to the high over-quota access tariffs (i.e. tariff free). As a result, total import volume levels often appear to exceed the established quota level by a substantial amount.


**NATIONAL MECHANICALLY SEPARATED CHICKEN**

The MSC market tone was steady to fully steady. Supplies of fresh 15-20% were adequate to well cleared; frozen in close balance to tight and held with confidence. Demand for fresh and frozen product was fair to good. Supplies of raw materials were close. Domestic and export trading was moderate to good with most inquiry from Mexico and Central American countries. Schedules were seasonally normal with a few disruptions due to equipment issues and storm impacts. Very few buyers and sellers have begun 2009 contract negotiation discussions this and last week with little to report. The majority are waiting until October and November to begin, though it is on everyone's minds.



The market tone on tom breast meat was steady to barely steady. Inquiry light to moderate with sellers resisting the lower buyer bids on frozen while trying to increase internal usage. Offerings available. The market tone on destrapped tenderloins was steady to weak with increased demand and trading noted at the lower trending price levels. Offerings adequate to instances burdensome and gradually becoming better balanced. The market tone on the balance of white meat was steady to instances firm. Demand moderate to instances good for the short to adequate offerings. The market tone on 4-8 lb. breasts was cautiously steady to steady for the light to instances moderate buyer interest. Offerings adequate to sometimes fully adequate. The market tone on institutional sized breasts ranged from cautiously steady to steady on non-basted Grade As with instances of increased confidence noted to steady to barely steady on the balance. Some improved demand and trading was being noted while other buyers continued to buy hand to mouth. Offerings varied by plant and ranged adequate to ample. Trading slow to moderate. For domestic: tom defatted gizzards 88, fresh scapula 123-127, Grade A non-basted rib breasts - 8-10 lb. 150, 12-14 lb. 180, 14-16 lb. 175-180, 16-18 lb. 175, plant grade breasts - 10-12 lb. 145, 18-20 lb. 165 cents delivered. For export: tom necks 31 cents delivered.
