For the first half of 2009 the top 5 countries receiving exports of shell eggs from the U.S. were: Hong Kong(10,770,478 dozen), Canada(8,587,455 dozen), United Arab Empirates(2,882,840 dozen), China(1,756,424 dozen, and Mexico(1,389,596 dozen).

The top 5 countries with the largest increase in exports of shell eggs from the U.S. for the first half of 2009 over the first half of 2008 were: Hong Kong(up 4,779,467 dozen), United Arab Empirates(up 1,639,040 dozen), China(up 1,140,774 dozen), Mexico(up 1,085,809 dozen), and The Bahamas(up 560,458 dozen)

For the first half of 2009 the top 5 countries receiving exports of egg products from the U.S. were: Japan(4616.6 mt), Canada(4174.8 mt), Mexico(1059 mt), Germany(1054.1 mt), and Denmark(730 mt).

The top 5 countries with the largest increase in exports of egg products from the U.S. for the first half of 2009 over the first half of 2008 were: Canada(up 2834.2 mt), France(up 152.4 mt), Saudi Arabia(up 146.7 mt), Denmark(up 131.8 mt), and Ecuador(up 92.9 mt).

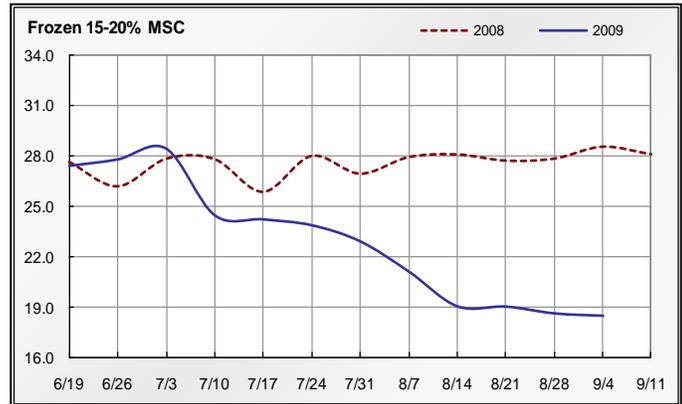
NATIONAL MECHANICALLY SEPARATED CHICKEN

The market tone was steady to barely steady on all fat contents with an unsettled undertone. Supplies of fresh and frozen 15-20% were adequate to available with the balance sufficient for current requirements. Many continue to closely monitor the marketplace in light of the contract season. Raw material supplies were adequate to available. Export and domestic demand remained light to moderate at best with some anticipating improvements to Mexico. Schedules were seasonally normal for the Labor Day holiday. Frame values were generally steady ranging mostly 7-9 cents FOB.

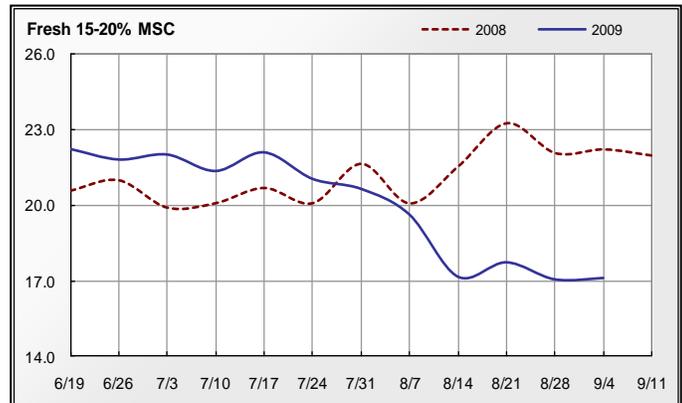

The market tone on tom bulk parts was steady to fully steady, instances firm on full-cut wings. Demand was light to moderate. Offerings ranged from tight to adequate with full-cut wings interest going unfulfilled. The trade sentiment on fresh tom breast meat was steady to firm, balance of white meat steady to fully steady. Demand was mixed. Offerings were light to adequate. The market tone on thigh meat was fully steady. Demand was light to moderate. Trading was slow to moderate. Domestic: breeder hen breast meat 106, fresh wing meat 106, fresh tails 21 and fresh full-cut wings 61 cents. Export: fresh thigh meat 86 and fresh tom drums 51 cents.
