## NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority Prices were 1 cent lower in the West, 4 cents lower in the Midwest and East when compared to early week prices. The market tone was barely steady in the Midwest, barely steady to weak elsewhere. Retail and food service demand was light to moderate entering the weekend. Supplies ranged moderate to heavy to satisfy current trade needs. Floor stocks were adequate to long. In the parts structure, movement was very light to good for late week trading. Wings were in the best position and remained light with very good movement. Supplies of breast items were heavy, however tenders were light and clearing well. Dark meat items were mostly heavy and slow to clear. In production areas, live supplies were moderate, weights were desirable to heavy.

**WESTERN REGION** The preliminary majority into Los Angeles was 93 cents, down 1 cent. The market tone was barely steady to weak on whole broiler/fryers. The market tone on WOGs was barely steady to fully steady on 3 lb. and under sizes and steady to weak on 3 lb. and heavier. Offerings mixed and ranged instances short to adequate on under 3 lb. sizes and adequate to ample on over 3 lb. sizes. Some inquiry for frozen 2.25 lb. sizes went unfilled. Retail and food service demand light to moderate. Weights desirable to instances heavier than desired. Floors stocks adequate. Offerings of wings light, breast items and leg quarters adequate to ample, balance of items adequate to fully adequate, instances ample. Parts demand light to moderate. The market tone on wings was fully steady to firm, breast items and leg quarters steady to weak, balance of items barely steady at best.

**MIDWEST REGION** Whole broiler/fryer market tone was barely steady. Offers adequate to available for the limited buyers needs. Retail and food service movement was slow to fair, fast food outlets providing the best interest. Floor stocks were adequate to long. Sizes desirable to heavy. Supplies of white and dark meat items adequate to ample, wings tight. Trade sentiment barely steady to weak on breast and dark meat items and firm on wings.

**NORTHEAST REGION** Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was slow and selective entering the weekend. Offerings of all sizes were heavy and slow to clear. Movement through retail and distributive channels was fair to moderate. The market tone was weak and unsettled. In the parts complex, supplies of wings were in close balance to short of current needs. Breasts items and most dark meat cuts were mostly heavy with limited movement. Tenders were moderate.

**SOUTHERN REGION** The market tone was barely steady. Retail and food service demand was light to moderate entering the weekend. Supplies of all sizes were more than sufficient to satisfy current trade needs. In the parts structure, movement was light to good for late week trading. Breast items were moderate to heavy, however wings were light and moving satisfactorily. Dark meat items were mostly heavy with discounting noted to help clear. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at desirable to heavy weights.

**DELMARVA** Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to fair entering the weekend. Seller offerings were moderate to mostly heavy with discounting reported. Live supplies were moderate; weights ranged desirable to heavy. Processor schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged to one cent lower at 67 to 81 cents. The market tone was barely steady to weak. In the parts complex, breast items were moderate to heavy with tenders noted in the best position. Dark meat cuts were moderate to usually heavy. Wings were in the strongest position overall with supplies very light.

Wings were in close balance to short. Retail and distributive movement was fair to moderate. The market tone was barely steady to weak for breast items and most dark meat cuts. Wings were firm.
