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NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority prices were trending 4 cents lower in Midwest, 2 cents lower in the East, and unchanged in the West. The market tone was about steady to weak in the East, barely steady to weak in the Midwest, and steady in the West. Retail and food service demand was light to moderate entering the weekend. Supplies of all sizes were moderate to heavy to handle current trade needs. Floor stocks were balanced to long. In the parts structure, movement was light to moderate for late week trading. Supplies of wings were mostly heavy with some discounting noted to help clear. Dark meat items were moderate to heavy with legs and drums in the weakest position. Supplies of breast items were moderate. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Trucklot buying activity on ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was light to fair at best entering the weekend. Offerings of all sizes were moderate to mostly heavy for current needs. Retail and distributive movement was fair to moderate. The market tone was weak. In the parts complex, legs and wings were readily available and slow to clear. Breast items and tenders were mostly moderate.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER The preliminary majority delivered prices into the Chicago market area were 4 cents lower. Whole broiler/fryer market tone was barely steady to weak. Offers of whole birds were moderate to heavy on continued light trade call. Retail and food service trade activity remained diminished, slow to moderate at best. Floor stocks were in balanced to long; weights in desirable range. Parts supplies continued to increase in availability, especially jumbo wings with discounts noted on wings, boneless/skinless breast and leg quarters. Trade was generally light and limited to needs. The trade sentiment was weak on wings and boneless/skinless breast, steady on bone-in breast and barely steady to weak on the balance of parts.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The Los Angeles preliminary majority was unchanged at 92 cents for next week delivery. The market tone on whole broiler fryers and WOGs was cautiously steady to steady. Offerings adequate. Retail and foodservice demand slow to moderate. Weights desirable. Floor stocks generally in balance. Offerings of bone-in breasts light, balance of parts and meats adequate to instances fully adequate. Parts demand light to fair. The market tone on bone-in breasts was steady, balance steady to barely steady.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER The market tone was about steady to barely steady. Demand entering the weekend was light to moderate, best where features were active and for end of the month business. Supplies of all sizes were moderate to heavy to satisfy current trade needs. In the parts structure, movement light to moderate for late week trading. Supplies of breast items were mostly moderate. Wings and dark meat items were moderate to heavy with legs in the weakest position. In production areas live supplies were moderate at mostly desirable weights.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to no better than fair entering the weekend. Offerings were moderate to heavy for current trade requirements. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed, but noted as mostly desirable. Processor schedules were usually moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices were 2 cents lower at 81 to 91 cents. The market tone was barely steady to weak. In the parts complex, breast items were moderate. Dark meat cuts were adequate to available. Wings were readily available.
