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NATIONAL EGG REVIEW

This week in New York, prices were sharply lower with regional prices unchanged. The trade sentiment was weak. Cartoned shell egg demand was moderate to good. Loose shell egg demand was light. Supplies were fully adequate to ample. Breaking stock prices were mostly unchanged. Demand was light with offerings adequate to fully adequate. Schedules were full-time to reduced for this week. Floor stocks were adequate to fully adequate. The trade sentiment was steady. North Central regional light type hen removal costs were unchanged. Demand was light to usually moderate while offerings were adequate. Processing schedules were full-time. The trade sentiment was steady.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Producer prices were 7 cents lower for large and medium and were unchanged for small. Midwest delivered prices were unchanged. The trade sentiment continues weak. Cartoned shell egg demand was light to moderate at best. Loose shell egg demand was light. Supplies were fully adequate to ample and building. Central states breaking stock prices were lower. Demand was light as most breaker needs covered; offerings were adequate to fully adequate. Floor stocks were adequate to fully adequate. Processing schedules were full-time to reduced this week due to the holiday. The trade sentiment was steady.

Some New England states were experiencing transportation and business issues due to road and stores closures brought about by severe flooding in the area. Supplies were fully adequate to available for current needs. Breaking stock offerings in the Eastern region were adequate to fully adequate for the moderate demand. Spent hen offerings were adequate for the fair to moderate demand.

WEEKLY FRYERS AVAILABLE FOR MARKETING

Based on the preliminary chick placements, the number of fryers available for marketing during the week ending 08-May-10 is estimated at 156.2 million head. This compares to 156.5 million head the previous week and to 158.9 million head the same week a year ago, when the slaughter was 160.9 million head and the composite weighted average price was 80.38 cents per pound.
