NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority prices were trending unchanged in the West, down 1 cent elsewhere when compared to early week prices. The market tone was steady to barely steady in the East, steady to weak elsewhere. Retail and food service demand was light to moderate for the long holiday weekend. Processing schedules were heavy with some plants operating on Saturday and some plants closed on Monday. Limited transport availability and high cost affect call in parts of the Midwest. Supplies of all sizes were adequate to fully adequate to satisfy current trade needs. Floor stocks were balanced to long. In the parts structure, movement was fair to moderate for end of the week trading. Breast items and wings were moderate to instances heavy, and dark meat items were mostly moderate with leg quarters clearing best. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at mostly desirable weights.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Trucklot buying activity for ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers improved slightly but was no better than fair entering the holiday weekend. Offerings of all sizes were more than sufficient for current needs. Retail and distributive movement was fair to moderate. The market tone was about steady. In the parts complex, supplies of boneless skinless breasts, tenders and wings were at least sufficient. Dark meat cuts were mostly moderate to instances heavy with leg quarters noted as increasing in availability. Bone-in breast were light to moderate.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER Preliminary delivered majority prices into the Chicago market area were one cent lower. The market tone on whole broiler/fryers was steady to weak. Whole bird offers were light to moderate. Trade need was very light as current commitments more than sufficient and limited transport availability and high cost affected call. Retail and food service demand covered the full range, mostly moderate to good. Floor stocks were in balance to ample; weights desirable to light. Parts offerings were heavy on boneless/skinless breast, moderate to heavy on dark meat cuts and large wings. The market tone was steady to weak on all parts.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The market on whole broiler fryers was generally steady and WOGs steady to weak. Offerings of whole fryers adequate and WOGs adequate to ample. Retail demand light to fair, instances good and with activity for the holiday weekend continuing to be below expectations for some. Food service demand light to moderate. Floor stocks adequate to instances heavy. The market on boneless skinless breasts and wings was steady to weak, tenderloins steady to instances weak with some spot discounting noted from pre-holiday weekend production, bone-in breasts steady and dark items steady to barely steady. Demand light to moderate. Offerings of boneless skinless breasts and wings adequate to heavy, bone-in breasts light to moderate, tenderloins mixed, dark items adequate to fully adequate.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER The market tone was steady to barely steady. Demand entering the holiday weekend was fair to moderate with limited trading for end of the month business. Supplies of all sizes were at least adequate to satisfy current trade needs. In the parts structure, movement was fair to moderate for late week trading. Breast cuts were moderate to instances heavy. Wings were moderate to more available and dark meat items were moderate with some discounting noted to help clear. In production areas live supplies were moderate. Weights were mostly desirable.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was fair to moderate entering the holiday weekend. Seller offerings were adequate to fully adequate for current trade needs. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed, but noted as desirable. Processor schedules were very heavy with most plants operating on Saturday and closed on Monday. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 90 to 98 cents. The market tone was about steady. In the parts complex, b/s breasts and wings were at least adequate. Bone-in breasts ranged light to moderate. Dark meat cuts were mostly moderate.

Trucklot buying activity improved slightly but still noted as no better than fair entering the holiday weekend. Offerings of boneless skinless breasts, tenders and wings were fully sufficient for current needs. Bone-in breasts were light to moderate and clearing satisfactorily. Dark meat cuts were adequate to fully adequate with leg quarters in the longest position. Retail and distributive movement was fair to moderate. The market tone was generally steady for most items.
