



NATIONAL EGG REVIEW

New York egg prices declined for extra large and large, mediums remained unchanged. Early in the week, regional prices were sharply lower on all sizes. Next week's regional asking prices were trending lower for extra large and large. Cartoned egg demand was light to moderate. Loose egg demand was light to at times moderate. Offerings were mostly moderate to instances heavy. Market activity was slow to moderate. Breaking stock prices, along with checks and undergrades, were lower. Demand was light to usually moderate. Offerings were moderate. Market activity was slow to moderate. North Central regional light type hen removal costs were steady. Demand was moderate to good with offerings light to moderate. Processing schedules varied part-time to full-time.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Producer prices are 2 cents lower on large. All other reported prices are steady. Retail demand is light to moderate and noted as slightly improved from earlier in the week. Food service demand is light to at times moderate. Supplies are moderate. Market activity is slow to moderate with a more moderate undertone. Central states breaking stock prices are steady. Offerings are moderate for the light to usually moderate demand. Market activity is slow to moderate.

Light hen offerings are about adequate to adequate for usually normal processing schedules.

**WEEKLY FRYERS AVAILABLE FOR MARKETING**

Based on the preliminary chick placements, the number of fryers available for marketing during the week ending 24-Jul-10 is estimated at 160.3 million head. This compares to 159.3 million head the previous week and to 159.9 million head the same week a year ago, when the slaughter was 162.6 million head and the composite weighted average price was 84.05 cents per pound.
