## NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Majority prices were trending unchanged in all areas when compared to early week prices. The market tone was steady overall with a firm undertone in the Midwest. Retail demand was light to moderate. Food service demand was slow to good, mostly moderate entering the weekend. Supplies of all sizes were light to moderate to satisfy current trade needs. Floor stocks were well cleared to heavy. In the parts structure, movement was light to instances good, mostly moderate for late week business. Supplies of breast items were light to heavy, mostly moderate and all remaining parts were moderate with good movement. In production areas, live supplies were moderate. Weight were mixed, but reported as mostly desirable.

**NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER** Trucklot buying activity for ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was mostly fair to moderate entering the weekend. Offerings of three pound and smaller sizes were moderate; heavier sizes were light to moderate for current trade needs. Retail and distributive movement was fair to moderate. The market tone was steady. In the parts complex, boneless skinless breast and tenders were in good balance to well cleared. The balance of items was mostly moderate.

**MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER** Chicago area preliminary delivered majority prices were unchanged. The whole broiler/fryer price trend was steady to instances firm. Whole bird offers were light to moderate on light to good trade inquiry. Floor stocks were well cleared to heavy; weights mixed. Parts price trend was steady to firm on breast cuts, barely steady to weak on dark meat lines and steady on other items. Retail demand was slow to moderate, while food service movement was slow to good. Best clearance was through fast food, restaurants and sports bars. Supplies of dark meat cuts were moderate to heavy and other parts were light to moderate.

**WESTERN BROILER/FRYER** The Los Angeles preliminary majority was 96 cents, unchanged from last week. The market on whole broiler fryers and WOGs was steady. Offerings of whole fryers and WOGs light to adequate. Retail and food service demand light to moderate. Floor stocks adequate. The market on wings was steady to barely steady with the balance of white items steady. The market on dark items was steady to barely steady. Demand light to moderate. Offerings of wings adequate to fully adequate with the balance of white items light to adequate. Offerings of dark items adequate to fully adequate.

**SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER** The market tone was steady. Demand into all channels was moderate entering the weekend. Supplies of all sizes were light to moderate to satisfy current trade needs. In the parts structure, movement was moderate for late week business. Supplies of wings were moderate and moving well. Supplies of breast item were moderate to instances light with increased interest noted on outlets and tenders. Supplies of dark meat items were moderate to occasionally heavy with drums in the weakest position. In production areas, live supplies were moderate. Weights were trending slightly lighter, but was mostly desirable.

**DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS** Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was fair to moderate entering the weekend. Seller offerings were sufficient for current trade needs. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed, but noted as desirable. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 89 to 98 cents. The market tone was steady. In the parts complex, supplies were adequate to fully adequate.
