## NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Whole broiler fryer prices are trending steady to lower in the Midwest, steady to barely steady in the West, and steady to weak in the East, when compared to early week prices. Preliminary majority prices are unchanged to 3 cents lower in the Midwest, 2 cents lower in the East, and unchanged in the West. Offerings are light to heavy, mostly moderate to heavy with weather conditions causing some disruptions in transportation schedules. Retail and food service demand is light to moderate as inclement weather conditions hamper most of the Northeast. Floor stocks are adequate. Market activity is slow. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week business. Prices are steady to firm for breast items, steady for dark meat and lower for wings. Offerings are mostly moderate for parts with the exception of wings which are heavy and discounted to help clear. Market activity is slow to moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mixed weights.

**NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER** Prices are trending steady to weak on all sizes. Trucklot buying activity for ready-to-cook whole broiler fryers is light and unaggressive entering the weekend as inclement weather conditions hampers most of the area. Offerings are moderate to heavy for current needs with the weather conditions causing some disruptions in transportation schedules. Trade activity is slow. In the parts complex, supplies of wings are readily available and heavily discounted. Other items are moderate to heavy.

**MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER** The preliminary Chicago majority price is unchanged to 3 cents lower from Monday's final majority. Whole broiler/fryers prices are steady to lower. Offerings are moderate to usually heavy. Demand is light to moderate. Weights are mixed. Market activity is slow. Parts prices are lower for wings and mostly steady for all other parts items. Supplies of all parts are moderate for current needs with the exception of wings which remain heavy. Food service movement is light to moderate, fast food demand is seasonally normal. Retail activity is light to moderate. Market activity is slow for wings and moderate for all other parts.

**WESTERN BROILER/FRYER** The Los Angeles preliminary majority is 94 cents, unchanged from last Monday. The market on whole broiler fryers and WOGs steady to barely steady. Offerings light to mostly moderate. Retail demand light to good, mostly light to moderate. Foodservice demand very light to good, mostly moderate. Weights desirable. Floor stocks adequate. The market on boneless skinless breasts and bone-in breasts is steady to fully steady with some spot noted on boneless skinless breasts, wings barely steady to weak, and tenderloins steady. The market on dark items is steady to fully steady. Demand light to good, mostly light to moderate. Offerings of wings moderate to heavy, tenderloins moderate, boneless skinless and bone-in breasts light to moderate. Offerings light to moderate. Retail movement light to good, mostly light to moderate. Foodservice movement very light to good, mostly moderate.

**SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER** Prices are trending weak for whole broilers and fryers. Supplies of all sizes are moderate to heavy for current trade needs. Demand entering the weekend is light. Market activity is slow. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week business. Prices are trending steady to firm for breast items with cutlets in good balance and moving well. Dark meat prices are trending steady, wings are lower. Offerings of cutlets are light, wings are heavy with discounting noted to help clear and dark meat items are moderate. Market activity is slow to moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed and noted as desirable to heavy.

**DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS** Less-than-trucklot asking prices is unchanged at 74 to 89 cents, with a steady to weak trending undertone. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds is light and unaggressive entering the weekend. Offerings are moderate to heavy for current trade requirements. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed. Processor schedules are moderately heavy. Market activity is slow. In the parts complex, supplies ranged light to moderate for breast items. The balance of items is moderate to heavy.
