NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Whole broiler fryer prices are trending fully steady to firm in the Midwest, steady to firm in the West, and steady to higher in the East. Offerings of all sizes are light to moderate with good movement. Preliminary majority prices were 4 cents higher in the Midwest, 2 cents higher in the East, and unchanged in the West when compared to early week prices. Retail and food service demand is light to good, mostly light to moderate as many retailers featured Lenten items. Floor stocks are light to moderate entering the weekend. Market activity is moderate to active. In the parts structure, movement is moderate to good for late week business. Prices continue to trend firm to higher for breast items, tenders, and most dark meat items. Wings are steady to at times firm. Offerings are light for breast items and most dark meat items, wings are mostly moderate. Market activity is moderate to active. In production areas, live supplies are moderate for mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER Prices are trending steady to firm for most sizes. Trucklot buying activity for ready-to-cook whole broiler fryers is mostly good entering the weekend. Offerings are light to moderate with good movement. Market activity is moderate to active. In the parts complex, supplies of breast items and tenders are light and well cleared; wings and most dark meat cuts are light to moderate.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER Preliminary majority prices were 4 cents higher into Chicago and TFEWR elsewhere in the Midwest. Whole bird prices are fully steady to firm. Whole bird offerings continued light. Demand into retail outlets is light to moderate as many retailers featured Lenten items while food service demand was light with fast food demand is normal to at times good. Weights are desirable to light. Market activity on whole birds is light to moderate. Parts prices are mixed with breast items, jumbo wings and leg items fully steady to firm and barely steady on small wings. Supplies of all parts are balanced to tight. Demand is light to moderate for all parts items. Market activity is moderate for parts with breast items and jumbo wings receiving the most interest.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The Los Angeles majority is 95 cents, unchanged from last Monday's final. The market on whole broiler fryers and WOGs is steady to firm. Offerings light. Retail and foodservice demand light to good, mostly moderate. Some of the active buyer interest is in response to buyers trying to purchase ahead of possible future price increases meanwhile more industry members comment on customer sticker shock in response to the higher trending prices. Floor stocks light to moderate. Weights desirable. The market on most parts and meat items is steady to firm. Domestic demand light to good, mostly moderate with more finding increased activity on wings into retail channels. Offerings of wings are light to moderate; boneless skinless breasts, tenderloins and bone-in breasts very light to light and held with confidence. Offerings of dark items are very light to light.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER Prices are holding higher for whole broiler/fryers. Offerings are light to satisfy current trade needs. Retail and food service demand is moderate to good entering the weekend. Market activity is active. In the parts structure, movement is moderate to good for late week trading. Prices for breast items and dark meat cuts are trending firm to higher, wings are steady to firm. Offerings are light for breast items with boneless skinless in the strongest position. Dark meat items are light to moderate with good movement and wings are moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS Less-than-trucklot asking prices are unchanged at 80 to 90 cents, with a steady to firm trending undertone. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds is moderate to good entering the weekend. Offerings are light to moderate for current trade needs. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mostly desirable. Processor schedules are moderately heavy. Market activity is moderate to active. In the parts complex, supplies are light to moderate.
