## NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



Prices are trending steady to barely steady in the West, steady elsewhere. Preliminary majority prices were unchanged in all areas when compared to early week prices. Offerings are light to moderate for the light interest. Retail and food service demand is light to moderate, best into fast food venues and where promotions are active. Floor stocks are light to moderate with sizes desirable to light. The market activity is moderate. In the parts structure, movement is moderate for late week business. Prices are trending steady to weak for small wings and boneless skinless breast. Tenders and most dark meat items are steady to firm with good movement. All remaining items are generally steady. Supplies are light for tenders, moderate to heavy for boneless skinless breasts, and moderate for all other items. Market activity for parts is moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate for mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

**NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER** Prices continue to trend steady for most sizes. Trucklot buying activity for ready-to-cook whole broiler fryers is mostly moderate entering the weekend. Offerings are sufficient for current needs. Trade activity is moderate. In the parts complex, supplies of tenders, thighs and thigh meat are light with good movement; heavy for wings and moderate to heavy for breast items.

**MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER** Preliminary majority was unchanged into Chicago and TFEWR in other cities. Whole bird prices were about steady. Offerings were light to moderate for the light interest. Retail and food service demand was light; best movement into fast food venues where promoted. Floor stocks were moderate with sizes desirable to light. Parts prices were weak on wings, barely steady on boneless skinless breasts and steady on dark meat items. Supplies of wings and boneless skinless breasts were moderate to heavy with the remainder of parts light to balanced. Parts demand was light to moderate. Overall parts market activity was light.

**WESTERN BROILER/FRYER** The Los Angeles preliminary majority is 95 cents, unchanged from last Monday's final. The market on whole broiler/fryers is steady and WOGs steady to weak with negotiated WOGs unchanged to lower for next week's deliveries. Offerings light to moderate. Retail demand light to moderate with improvement being reported for first of the month business. Foodservice demand light to good, mostly light to moderate with convention areas continuing to report the best activity. Floor stocks moderate. Weights desirable. The markets on bone-in breasts and wings are steady to barely steady with lower trending trading reported, and tenderloins are steady to firm. The market on boneless skinless breasts is steady to weak with some not finding the weakness others are. The market on dark items is steady to firm. Demand light to good, mostly light to moderate. Offerings of wings moderate to sometimes heavy, bone-in breasts light to moderate, boneless skinless breasts moderate to instances moderately heavy, and tenderloins very light to light. Offerings of dark items are very light to light. Fill-in trading was reported on wings at 75 cents delivered. Movement light to good, mostly light to moderate.

**SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER** Prices are holding steady for whole broiler/fryers. Offerings are moderate for current trade needs. Demand entering the weekend is moderate for first of the month business. Market activity is moderate. In the parts structure, movement is moderate for late week business. Prices are trending steady to firm for tenders and thigh meat, steady to weak for wings with small wings in the weakest position. All other parts are generally steady. Offerings are light to moderate for tenders and thigh meat, moderate to heavy for wings. The market activity is moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate. Weights are mostly desirable.

**DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS** Less-than-trucklot asking prices are unchanged at 77 to 88 cents, with a steady trending undertone. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds ranged seasonally light to moderate entering the weekend. Seller offerings are sufficient for present trade needs. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mostly desirable. Processing schedules are moderately heavy. Market activity is moderate. In the parts complex, supplies are moderate to heavy for wings and b/s breasts. Tenders, thighs, and drums are light. The balance of parts are light to moderate.

Trucklot buying activity improved slightly entering the weekend and was noted as moderate overall. Offerings are light to moderate for tenders and most dark meat cuts; moderate to heavy for wings and generally sufficient for the balance of items. Movement is moderate.
