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NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT-A-GLANCE



New York and regional prices are steady on all sizes. Asking prices for next week's deliveries are trending higher on larger sizes, steady on Mediums. Food service demand continues light to moderate. Retail demand is mixed, mostly moderate to good and best where ads are featured. Supplies range light to instances heavy for trade purposes and vary by region. Market activity is moderate but slowing in the Northeast. Breaking stock offerings are light; demand is generally light to moderate. Light type hen offerings are light to fully adequate with normal to reduced processing schedules.

EGG PRODUCTS**Shell Eggs Broken Up 2 Percent from Last Year**

Shell eggs broken totaled 175 million dozen during May 2011, up 2 percent from May a year ago, and 7 percent below the 164 million broken last month.

During calendar year 2011 through May, shell eggs broken totaled 844 million dozen, up 3 percent from the comparable period in 2010. To date, cumulative total edible product from eggs broken in 2011 was 1,103 million pounds, up 3 percent from 2010.
