



EGG MARKET NEWS REPORT

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NATIONAL EGG REVIEW

New York prices are 5 cents higher on Large and Extra Large, 7 cents higher on Medium. California prices are 71 cents higher on Extra Large and Large, up 90 cents on Jumbo, Medium and Small. The undertone is higher, however steady to higher in the Northeast region. Offerings are light to moderate and noted as held with confidence in the Midwest and South Central regions. Supplies are light to moderate. Demand into the retail and distributive channels ranges light to occasionally good, mostly moderate to fairly good. Market activity is slow to moderate in California, while moderate to active in the remaining regions. Breaking stock supplies are generally moderate; breaking schedules are full-time. Light type hen offerings are at least sufficient for the light to moderate demand.



Liquid Eggs

All liquid egg products prices are too few to report. Trade sentiment is steady for whole egg, steady to higher for whites and higher for yolk. Offerings are moderate for whole egg, light to moderate for whites and light for yolk. Demand is light to moderate for all liquid products. Market activity is slow.

Frozen Eggs

Frozen whole egg and white prices are lower with sugared yolk prices steady to lower and salted yolk prices steady to higher. Trade sentiment is steady for whole egg and steady to higher on the balance of frozen egg products. Offerings are moderate to instances heavy for whole egg and light to moderate for whites and usually light for frozen yolk products. Demand is moderate to good for whole egg as buyers feel the market has reached the bottom and are beginning to restock for future needs. Frozen white demand is light to moderate while demand for frozen yolk products is good. Supplies are moderate for whole egg and whites and light for frozen sugared and salted yolk. Market activity is moderate.

Dried Eggs

Dried egg prices are steady to higher for yolk, lower for whole and albumen and steady for blends. The undertone is higher on yolk, lower on whole and albumen and steady on blends. Offerings are light to moderate on yolk and usually moderate on the balance of product. Demand is fairly good to good on dried yolk, light to moderate on whole and light on albumen. Supplies are at times light to moderate. Inquires increased with trading centered around contractual commitments and spot orders. Market activity is mostly moderate.

Live Spent Light Fowl

Prices are trending steady for the light to moderate demand. Offerings of light type hens are at least sufficient for current needs. Processing schedules increased slightly due to some Saturday operations. Movement of finished product is moderate for current needs. Market activity is moderate. The majority price for removal costs remained unchanged at 0-7 cents per head. Retail activity was very light.
