



EGG MARKET NEWS REPORT

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NATIONAL EGG REVIEW

Regional and California prices are 12 cents lower on Jumbo, 12 to 15 cents lower on Extra Large, 8 to 16.5 cents lower on Large, 18.5 to 27.5 cents lower on Medium and 21 cents lower on Small. New York egg prices are 8 cents lower on all sizes. The undertone is lower. Offerings and supplies are moderate to heavy for current trading purposes. Retail demand is mostly light. Food service demand ranges light to fairly good. Market activity is slow to moderate in the Southeast, slow in the remaining areas. Breaking stock supplies are moderate to heavy for a usually light demand. Offerings of light hens are sufficient for slightly reduced processing schedules.

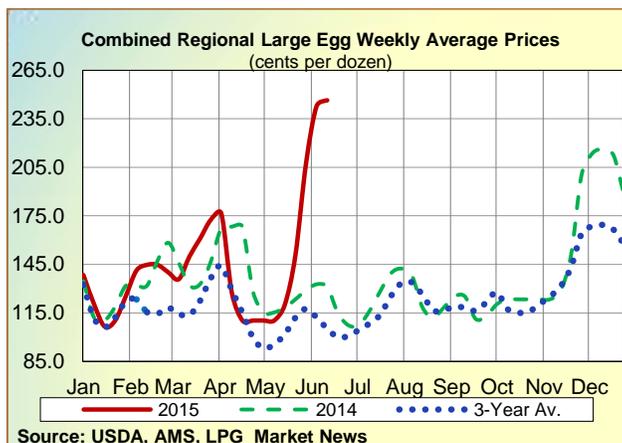

Liquid Eggs

Liquid whole egg prices are higher to sharply higher when compared to the last reported prices. Liquid whites and yolk continue too few to report. The undertone remains steady to mostly higher. Offerings are light to usually short of current needs on good to very good demand. Market activity is moderate. Non-pasteurized in trucklots; current trading for delivery within 14 days.

Frozen Eggs

Frozen salted yolk prices are steady to higher with the remainder of frozen egg product prices higher. The undertone is usually higher. Offerings are short of current needs while many buyers attempt to replace frozen egg products with shell eggs where applications allow. Demand is good to very good. Supplies are very light. Market activity is slow. Packed in 30-pound containers; less-than-trucklot reflects a minimum volume of 25 containers.

Dried egg prices are higher for whole, yolk, albumen and blends. The undertone is higher on all products. Demand is good to very good with fewer inquires noted. Offerings are light to short of needs. Supplies are light to very light as processors work to supply regular commitments in a hand to mouth fashion. Market activity is slow.

Live Spent Light Fowl

Prices are trending steady for the moderate at best demand. Offerings of light type hens are sufficient for current needs. Processing schedules were reduced slightly. Movement of finished product are sufficient. Market activity is slow to moderate. The majority price for removal costs remained unchanged at 0-7 cents per head. Feature activity was light with best interest being in the Northeast region.
