APPALACHIAN DISTRICT(VA, WV, MD, PA) 2012 SEASON Growers are on Gala harvest. Demand continues to exceed supplies as Michigan and a few New York processors continue to increase pressure on purchases. Trading very active. Prices about steady. Canners U.S. One paid to growers, delivered to processors per hundredweight and includes contract sales 2 1/2 inch minimum (includes some undersized fruit) 22.00-26.00 few higher. Straight loads of juice stock per hundredweight (cwt) U.S. Cider grade 20.00-25.00 occasional higher. Quality variable. Recent rains are causing some Galas to crack. Season running two weeks ahead of normal.

NEW YORK 2012 SEASON Movement is expected to increase seasonally. Demand is fairly active for limited early season supplies. Prices for Juice Stock and Canners/Peelers are about steady. Purchase prices are variety, size and quality dependent. Prices for processing apples on Wednesday, August 22, 2012 F.O.B. packing house or receiving station per cwt. 2012 crop: Canners/Peelers - (Utilizing All Available Varieties): \$22.00-25.00, mostly 22.00-22.50, includes previous commitments. Juice Stock - (Utilizing All Available Varieties): \$20.00-25.00 mostly 22.00, includes previous commitments.

WASHINGTON: 2011 SEASON Offerings to processors very light. Trading very light. A few sheds are still running cherries, along with peaches and nectarines. Preparations are being made for incoming new crop apples.

Forecast for mostly sunny and highs in the 90Fs. Prices for apples on Wednesday August 22, 2012 F.O.B. Packing house or receiving station Per ton 2011 Crop. Juice stock peelers Offerings insufficient to establish a market.

2011 SEASON Offerings to processors very light. Trading very light. Volume should pick up as field run becomes more available over the next few weeks.


